SFENJ (Moroccan Chanukah doughnuts)

3 cups all-purpose flour1 envelope active dry yeast 1 tablespoon salt1 tablespoon granulated sugar 1 tablespoon vegetable oil 1 egg 1 1/2 cups water (105 to 110 F) Vegetable oil for frying Powdered sugar for sprinkling Honey for dipping


Mix together flour, yeast, salt and granulated sugar. Add oil and egg, mixing lightly. Add the water slowly, using your hands to work it into the mixture. Knead the dough gently; shape it into a ball. Place in a lightly oiled bowl, cover, and let rise in a warm place for about 1 1/2 hours.

Wet hands slightly, then roll dough into small balls. Flatten, then create a hole using your finger, and stretch the dough gently.

In a deep pot, heat oil to 350 F. Drop sfenj carefully into hot oil. When lightly browned and crusty, turn and finish frying.

Sprinkle with powdered sugar. Serve warm with honey for dipping.

Makes about 20 sfenj.


We said goodbye on July 3, 2017, to Dina Berger, who died on June 30, 2017, 20 days shy of her 93rd birthdate.

Dina Berger was many things in her nearly 93 years: a teacher, nurse, translator, butcher shop owner with her husband Gabriel, a rose expert, a fashion icon, brave as all hell, and the most loving and generous mother and grandmother in the world.

The amount of love she had to give and the pride she had for our family was inspiring and we will miss her forever. She used to end every conversation with her 3 granddaughters: Laila Tov, I love you.

Featured in the Jewish Journal, September 28, 2017

Shelters for Israel celebrated its 69th anniversary with a luncheon on Sept. 10 at Temple Emanuel of Beverly Hills.

Drawing about 225 people, the event benefited Sulamot–Music for Social Change, an education program for at-risk children and a collaboration between the Israel Philharmonic Orchestra (IPO), Tel Aviv University and the Israel Defense Forces (IDF).

"We chose Sulamot because we were impressed with their model — in partnership with the IPO, the IDF and Tel Aviv University — to reach out to thousands of disadvantaged, at-risk children throughout Israel and provide musical instruments and instruction to them," Shelters for Israel Co-President Myra Gabbay said.

Shelters for Israel, a Los Angeles-based nonprofit, was founded in 1948 by a group of female Hungarian Holocaust survivors who moved to the United States following World War II. Aware of a housing shortage in Israel due to an influx of immigrants, they used money from a regular card game to create a loan fund for the new arrivals to the fledging Jewish state.

To date, the volunteer-led organization has sponsored more than 50 capital projects in Israel serving the elderly, Negev and the Galilee communities, disadvantaged youth and others. Among its current projects is a three-year program in Mitzpe Ramon in the Negev, where the city has committed to match the organization's funding and build a music school for graduates of the Sulamot program.

Participants in the the event included David Jackson, Shelters for Israel co-president; Rabbi Alan Kalinsky, director of the Orthodox Union's West Coast region; Holocaust survivor Eva Brettler and Beverly Hills High School 2016 graduate Lauren Aviram.

The highlight of the luncheon was when the Sulamot Klezmer Band from Israel performed klezmer and classic Jewish and Israeli music, Gabbay said. "It was special to dance with the survivors and subsequent generations to the music of these exceptional young people."

Chanukah Latkes

INGREDIENTS

1-2 pounds russet potatoes, peeled and coarsely grated

1 medium onion, grated (can substitute tsp onion powder)

1 1/4 cups matzo meal

3/4 cup chopped fresh chives (optional)

5 large eggs

1 tablespoon kosher salt

3/4 teaspoon freshly ground black pepper

Canola Oil



Grate potatoes and let soak in large bowl. Rinse/squeeze all water from potatoes until water is mostly clear. *Famous tip – do not squeeze out all the starch.

Combine potatoes with grated onion, matzo meal & chives. Mix in eggs and add salt & pepper to taste. Garlic and/or Garlic Salt may also be added.

Heat 2 to 3 tablespoons of oil in a large skillet over medium heat. Make "palm size" balls of potato mix and flatten before placing in skillet. Cook until crisp (3 min) flip and cook another 2-3 minutes. Transfer to paper towel lined plate. Add oil in between batches.
